**The Olive Pit:** Start your day off with some farm-to-fork flavors at the Olive Pit! Try out a wide selection of olives, olive oils, flavored balsamic vinegars, tapenades and more at their olive tasting bar.



**Downtown Red Bluff:** Head up north and stop for lunch in downtown Red Bluff. While you're there, make sure to check out the shopping - with a variety of locally-owned boutiques there's always something interesting and unique to be found!
